After 20 years of sitting idle, Greenville's 1901 Armitage Herschell Carousel is once again open to the public. The Delta Children's Museum and the Greenville Junior Woman's Club have worked closely over the last three years to bring "Greenville's Treasure" back home. The Carousel is housed in the Delta Children's Museum Pavilion in E. E. Bass Cultural Arts Center in Greenville.

The history and mechanism of the Carousel will be explained, and the children will participate in a hands-on science activity. Every student will have the opportunity to take a ride on the Carousel and experience the benefits of a simple machine first-hand!



Our field trip is designed to meet requirements for 5th Grade students, but we are happy to design a tour for different grade levels. This field trip can accommodate both large and small groups of students, with a charge of \$5 per participant. Prior to your visit, we will send you a comprehensive Tour and Educational Packet that will cover multiple competencies, including:

- **Social Studies:** Using a timeline to analyze spatial and ecological relationships between people, places, and environments
- **Science:** Designing and constructing a simple machine
- **English/Language Arts:** Composing descriptive texts relating to an event
